- --<u>Treasurer</u> report \$24,014.18 approved. 2 tickets for the Beginner Bee Class tonight. -- The Raffle for JUL, AUG & SEP will pay for 2 members ea. month to attend the Beginner Bee Class in Sept.
- --In March we will have 6 tickets for the Bee College to raffle off at the JAN, FEB & MAR meetings.
- -- Presidents Report: We sold 5 NUCS at the Mentor Meeting \$80 ea., (\$400)
- -- <u>Hive Management</u> keep control of SHB and Mites, now is the month to treat Mites.
- --We are in Summer Dearth. FEED your bees and if they are getting irritable/defensive use your sugar water spray to calm them down. Thunderstorms and Queenless hives can contribute to defensive behavior.
- --If you are looking for Queens: Santa Fe Queens in High Springs FL and Hives and More in Switzerland, FL
- --You can still do splits and raise Queens but be sure you have plenty of Drones. AND note this is the buildup of Dragon Flies and they prey on honeybees esp queens.
- --Put Swarm Traps out for the end of Summer Swarms—Now is the time to think 6 months out and get ready for Winter and plan for next Spring.
- -- APIARY we have 6 Langstroth hives, 26 NUCS and we lost our 1 Top Bar hive.
- --What's Blooming: Asters, Bottle Brush, Mexican Sun Flowers. Feed your bees; flowers and plants have a lot of pollen now but not much nectar.
- --Membership Report: 214 members to date.
- -- Mentor Report; last Mentor Class hosted 35.

--7:30 Our Speaker Susan Welch on Candle Making: Capping's to Candles. There are many sources of wax; Susan prefers wax from the cappings only to give a cleaner wax and you can buy wax or order wax pellets from Thomas Honey that make regular trips to Fleming Is and Orange Park.

- --Use a double boiler to simmer your wax and in ½ inch of water. It can't boil or it can catch fire. Keep the temp between 155 and 175 degrees for the best tempering for candles.
- --Use cheesecloth or coffee filters to pour your wax through and leave it for a few hours to cool then remove the cheesecloth. What is left in the pot is called "Slum Gum". This can be used for startling fire, lip balm, furniture polish and hand lotion. They can be poured into the toilet paper cardboard, left to harden and used to rub on your foundations.
- --Use the square braided wick, it handles heat better
- --Magazines for candle ideas: Mann Lake Itd.com/ Better Bee.com/ Temu.com/ Blueridge Honey Company. ---There is an article in Mann Lake on how to use leftover wax.
- --Be sure to practice a few times before making your give-away candles. If you plan to sell your candles, be sure you complete the proper paperwork, they are not part of the Cottage Industry. Ou must have warning labels, and a license, etc.
- --Things to have on hand; scissors, parchment paper to protect surfaces, meat thermometer, wooden spoon, needles, wicks, pitcher for pouring melted wax and your molds.
