--<u>Presidents Report</u>

--Don Comer is still making Swarm Traps and will take orders tonnite.

--Remember to keep control of Small Hive Beetles (SHB) and treat with Beetle Grease (recipe on web site) also monitor for Mites and plan to treat 4X/year.

--Keep feeding your bees

--Get your hives ready for spring now, repair equipment, paint etc.

--Get your swarm traps out now and bait them.

--<u>APIARY</u> we have 4 Langstroth hives, 22 NUCS and 1 Top Bar hive without bees.

--What's blooming: Red Maple, Peaches, Plums, all flowers starting to bloom.

--Membership Report: 246 members to date.

--<u>Mentor Report;</u> last meeting was 36.

-- Dave noted packages of bees will be ready in March. 50 have been ordered and they are all claimed. Dave has requested to get more bees if needed—please sign his sheet tonight to get on the new list. Cost \$104 with \$1 for gas. --7:40 Our Speaker tonight is Dave Sieruta on Making Splits to Prevent Swarming, using it as a Brood Break and to increase your hives numbers. He notes that Jamie Ellis from UF has several U-Tube videos on this subject and Frank noted that we have many on our web site under the Library/Videos.

Be sure you have plenty of Nurse bees when you transfer your old Queen and young brood to your NUC to split your original hive. This maneuver is used as a Brood Break to decrease SHB. Check your hive for more than one Queen, she will be the daughter of your old Queen. If the hive starts a new queen, she will take approx. 30 days from egg to laying.

8:15 Sue Welch explained the CCF to all and asked for volunteers to work the dates APR 3-13. She passed a sign-up sheet. Also noting we will clean the Honey House MAR 22 at 10AM, Honey Bottling MAR30 at 12PM, there will be a FAIR Luncheon for volunteers MAR 25 at 11AM at the Cattlemen's Arena.
